In times of crisis, there is a side of people we seldom see. I always wonder why our minds need to be shocked into viewing people, even people we disagree with, to see them as God sees them. Maybe we need to daily ask God to be released from our carnal nature so that the spiritual person can thrive. Just thinking...

My wonderful body:

Do all to the glory of God

"Whether therefore you eat, or drink, or whatsoever you do, do all to the glory of God." 1Cor 10:31

In order to preserve health, temperance in all things is necessary - temperance in labor, temperance in eating and drinking. Our heavenly Father sent the light of health reform. . . that those who love purity and holiness may know how to use with discretion the good things He has provided for them, and that by exercising temperance in daily life they may be sanctified through the truth.

Great care should be taken to form right habits of eating and drinking. The food eaten should be that which will make the best blood. The delicate organs of digestion should be respected. God requires us, by being temperate in all things, to act our part toward keeping ourselves in health. . . The spiritual experience is greatly affected by the way in which the stomach is treated. Eating and drinking in accordance with the laws of health promote virtuous actions.

Principle should rule instead of appetite or fancy. . . It means much to be true to God. He has claims upon all who are engaged in his service. He desires that mind and body be preserved in the best condition of health, every power and endowment under the divine control, and as rigorous as careful, strictly temperate habits can make them. . . Temperance in eating, drinking, sleeping, and dressing is one of the grand principles of the religious life. Truth

brought into the sanctuary of the soul will guide in the treatment of the body.

The better you observe the laws of health, the more clearly you can discern temptations, and resist them, and the more clearly you discern the value of eternal things. May the Lord help you to make the most of your present opportunities and privileges, that you may daily gain new victories, and finally enter the city of God, as those who have overcome by the blood of the lamb and the word of their testimony.

Seventh-day Adventists accept the Bible as their only creed and hold certain fundamental beliefs to be the teaching of the Holy Scriptures. These beliefs constitute the church's understanding and expression of the teaching of Scripture.

In this issue of our newsletter, we'll look at the doctrine of:

THE FATHER

God the eternal Father is the Creator, Source, Sustainer, and Sovereign of all creation. He is just and holy, merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness. The qualities and powers exhibited in the Son and the Holy Spirit are also those of the Father. (Gen. 1:1; Deut. 4:35; Ps. 110:1, 4; John 3:16; 14:9; 1 Cor. 15:28; 1 Tim. 1:17; 1 John 4:8; Rev. 4:11.)

The Bible tells us that God is our Father—a good, perfect, loving Father. Human fathers may fail us, but we have a Father in Heaven who loves us with a perfect, unconditional love. <u>Jesus</u> taught us to call Him "our father." He exists in eternal and mysterious unity with the Son and the <u>Holy Spirit</u> as one Godhead, and is the source of everything in existence. God the Father desires to have a relationship with each one of us. He loves His children with an everlasting love and <u>He wants to spend time with you.</u> He doesn't want us to be anxious or afraid. He has promised to care for us so we can go through life without fear. Just like earthly parents need to lovingly discipline their children, God also disciplines His children to teach us to obey Him.

And we are his witnesses of these things; and so is also the Holy Ghost, whom God hath given to them that obey him" (Acts 5:32 KJV). "My son, do not despise the LORD's discipline or be weary of his reproof, for the LORD reproves him whom he loves, as a father the son in whom he delights" (Proverbs 3:11,12 ESV). We are subject to His authority because He made us and gifted us an existence. When He speaks, we would do well to listen. God's Word is powerful, and He is all that is holy. "Fear God and give him glory, because the hour of his judgment has come, and worship him who made heaven and earth, the sea and the springs of water" (Revelation 14:7, ESV).

But what does it mean to fear God and give Him glory?

And because He is God, it only makes sense to revere Him. We are told that the "fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight" (Proverbs 9:10, ESV).

We show God respect and acknowledge His ultimate sovereignty by devoting ourselves to <u>studying His words in the Bible</u> and understanding His precepts. This helps us recognize our sinfulness and inadequacy—<u>our need for a savior</u>. In return, He will give us wisdom. "Therefore let us be grateful for receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, and thus let us offer to God acceptable worship, with reverence and awe, for our God is a consuming fire" (Hebrews 12:28,29, ESV).
